Recommended Supplies for High School Math

1. **Texas Instruments Ti-84 Calculator**—Color edition is not necessary as it is more expensive, but it can be helpful in the upper-level classes where we will be comparing several graphs at once.

Used calculators are often available online or in second-hand shops. Also, keep in mind that this investment will carry your child through all of high school and college, so even if you buy new, it will be worth it in the long run!

2. **One 1-inch Binder**—This binder can be new or used. You may consider the *Five Star Flex Hybrid* as it is lightweight, flexible, and comes with pocketed dividers.
3. **Loose notebook paper *and* graph paper**—always on-hand in the binder.
4. **Pencils and Extra Erasers**—Some students also find that **colored pencils, colored pens, and/or highlighters** are helpful, but those are optional and often available in the classroom anyway.
5. **Geometry students should also have protractors and compasses.**

Please Note:

Though we are asking every child at every level to have a graphing calculator, there will be times when your child, regardless of course or grade level, will be graded on his/her ability to perform tasks *without* a calculator of any kind.

Don't worry, we make sure non-calculator questions are manageable and meaningful.
