

Dual Enrollment

Juniors and seniors may dual-enroll in college credit courses. Dual enrollment means that a student is enrolled in a college course that receives both high school and college credit. CCS partners with Bryan College, Carson-Newman University and Tennessee Technological University for dual enrollment courses.

Students are allowed to only take courses that are not offered at CCS for dual enrollment credit. The exceptions are US History, Economics, and English IV . Students can take world/foreign languages courses that are not offered at CCS as dual enrollment courses with prior approval from the high school office.

Qualifications to take any dual enrollment courses:

- Must be a junior or senior
- Must have a 3.0 minimum cumulative grade point average (GPA)
- ACT score of 18 in English and 19 in Reading

Tennessee Tech University DE courses offered online only

- American Sign Language I (fall)
- American Sign Language II (spring)

Must apply for admission to TN Tech University's dual enrollment program. Apply online at www.tntech.edu/DEapply. There is a \$25 application fee. Request a copy of your high school transcript sent to TN Tech University.

All dual enrollment courses offered through Tennessee Tech University are offered as online courses only.

Dual Enrollment Grant

The state of Tennessee does offer a dual enrollment grant to help pay for dual enrollment courses.

- Be a Tennessee resident for at least 12 months
- Complete the dual enrollment grant application at:

- Students may receive an award amount for the first five dual enrollment courses which is the cost of tuition. For a student's sixth through tenth courses, the award amount is \$100 per credit hour.
- Must maintain a minimum 2.0 grade point average (GPA) for all dual enrollment courses to remain eligible for the dual enrollment grant.
